S'more summer ahead!

Just in case you don't have a campfire handy, use this easy recipe for making S'mores crispy treats in your kitchen (with the guidance of an adult). You'll have lots of great gooey fun together!



INGREDIENTS

3 Tablespoons of unsalted butter 1 Pinch of salt

5 Cups of mini marshmallows (divide into 4C and 1C) 6 Cups of graham cereal pieces 3 - 1.5 ounce milk chocolate bars, broken into pieces

INSTRUCTIONS

Spray a 9" x 13" pan with non-stick cooking spray and set aside.

In a large stock pot, melt butter and salt over medium heat. When melted, add 4 cups of mini marshmallows and stir until completely melted.

Remove mixture from heat and stir in cereal pieces. Add remaining cup of mini marshmallows and stir just enough to combine.

Quickly pour half the mixture into the prepared pan and press down. Top with half of the chocolate pieces. Pour the rest of the mixture onto the chocolate and press down. Then top with the remaining chocolate pieces.

Place in refrigerator for about an hour, or sit on counter at room temperature for a few hours. Remove from pan and cut into bars. (Makes 24 servings.)
